NOTICE OF APPEAL - EXPLANATORY NOTES

Please read the following notes carefully before completing and submitting the Notice of Appeal Form. The form can be accessed below these notes.

The form is to be used for the Notice of Appeal when appealing a decision made by the Registration Authority (Engineering New Zealand), under the Chartered Professional Engineers of New Zealand Act 2002.

1. Background

CPEC may hear appeals on decisions made by the Registration Authority under the Chartered Professional Engineers of New Zealand Act 2002 ("the Act") and such appeals are conducted by rehearing.

CPEC may make any decision the Registration Authority would have been entitled to make under the Act.

If CPEC upholds an appeal, it's decision replaces the Registration Authority's decision. If CPEC declines an appeal, the Registration Authority's decision stands. Until CPEC issues its decision on the appeal the Registration Authority's decision stands.

2. Time frame

A notice of appeal must be filed within 28 days of receipt of the decision from the Registration Authority.

Alternatively, you may file a request for an extension of time to file a notice of appeal, but any such request must be filed within 28 days of receipt of the decision from the Registration Authority.

Failure to do one or the other, will result in your appeal not being accepted and therefore not heard.

3. Type of decision being appealed

There are two types of decisions by the Registration Authority which may be appealed to CPEC, they are:

Complaint Decision - A decision about a complaint against a Chartered Professional Engineer, or

<u>Registration Decision</u> - A decision about an application for registration or continued registration as a chartered professional engineer.

4. CPEC's jurisdiction

CPEC's jurisdiction is limited to reviewing the evidence pertaining to the case and making its own decision on the outcome.

5. The Decision or Parts of the Decision being Appealed

A full description of the decision or part of the decision being appealed is required in the Notice of Appeal. A copy of the original decision should also accompany the Notice of Appeal.

6. The Grounds of Appeal

A clear description of the reasons you are appealing the decision or part of the decision should be stated. However, detailed submissions are not required with the Notice of Appeal, such details more appropriately included in the formal submission process once the appeal is underway.

7. The Outcome Sought

CPEC does not have the jurisdiction to order any payment of fees or compensation, to order the completion of work or the issue of a document. Similarly, CPEC does not have jurisdiction to resolve commercial or contractual disputes.

Whilst the Act provides for costs associated with the appeal process to be awarded, it is noted that in almost all appeals to date CPEC has ordered that each party carries its own costs.

8. Submission of form

The form should be submitted by downloading, completing and emailing to info@cpec.org.nz.

No documents or evidence other than the copy of the decision should be provided with the Notice of Appeal. Other evidence can be provided as part of the submission process after the appeal is under way.
